Information about Dr. Magaziner:

Dr. Magaziner is professor of Epidemiology and Preventive Medicine, Medicine and Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation Science in the School of Medicine, University of Maryland, and adjunct professor in the Erickson School of Aging, Management and Policy. He is credited with developing the Division of Gerontology in the Department of Epidemiology and Preventive Medicine, which he currently leads. Dr. Magaziner pursues research in aging in three interrelated areas: the consequences of hip fracture; health and long-term care; and methods for studying older populations. The major focus of this work is to identify ways of enhancing functioning and improving the quality of life for older persons. The specific conditions which Dr. Magaziner has targeted are hip fracture and dementia. Studies include examining changes in bone and muscle following hip fracture, changes in bone turnover, hip fracture outcomes in men and the outcomes of dementia in long-term care settings.
