Third Year and Beyond

Once students have completed all of the required and elective coursework, they must maintain a full-time registration for the duration of their program. The definition of full-time registration requires each student to be registered for at least 12 credits each

term. Students who have not yet passed the school-wide oral exam should register for 12 credits of special studies (300.840) with their advisor to work on their dissertation proposal; once a student has passed the school-wide oral exam, they should register for dissertation research credits, 300.820.
