

Harriet A. Washington is the author of *Medical Apartheid: The Dark History of Medical Experimentation on Black Americans from Colonial Times to the Present*. Her book won the 2007 Nonfiction Award from the Black Caucus of the American Library Association and was named one of the year's Best Books by Publishers' Weekly. It has been praised in periodicals from the *Washington Post* and *Newsweek* to the *Times of London* and it has been excerpted in New York Academy of Sciences' Update. Experts have praised its scholarship, accuracy and insights. She has worked as a journalist and editor for USA Today and other publications.
