All degree programs are currently offered on a full-time enrollment basis only. MHS and PhD applicants will apply to one of the four program areas below. Graduates will acquire a wide range of knowledge and skills based on their chosen program area, including the following examples:

- **Global Disease Epidemiology and Control** Identify disease etiologies and design, implement and evaluate disease control interventions for diseases of global public health importance.
- **Health Systems** Assess the performance of health systems in multiple dimensions and for vulnerable populations, and design, manage and evaluate strategies to strengthen health systems.
- **Human Nutrition** Identify the major nutrition issues of public health importance to underserved populations, and design and evaluate strategies for prevention and/or treatment.
- **Social and Behavioral Interventions** Attain expertise in conducting qualitative and formative research, and learn how to develop and evaluate behavioral and community interventions to improve health and nutrition.
