HIV Counseling and Testing Program

SOURCE offers a special HIV Counseling and Testing Program. Students accepted to this program will be trained to be a state certified HIV counselor in a weekend training, matched with one of three SOURCE community partners who do HIV testing/counseling, and have the opportunity to volunteer with that organization throughout the year and beyond. This is a truly unique experience, and limited spaces are available. The training will take place on **Sat and Sun, October 10th and 11th, 9 am-5 pm both days**, as well as **Wed, Oct 14th, 3 pm—6 pm**, and requires a \$25 fee, to be paid after acceptance into the program.
