The newly created SOURCE (Student Outreach Resource Center) now serves the Schools of Medicine, Nursing and Public Health. SOURCE serves as a channel for faculty, staff and student involvement with community organizations and local projects. The center was formed in order to coordinate the volunteer activities of the three schools. SOURCE is the focal point for students seeking volunteer exposure in an urban environment. Our relationships extend to over 90 community based organizations and affiliates. The SOURCE has a particular, but not exclusive, focus on East Baltimore neighborhoods near the Johns Hopkins Medical Institutions. Students, faculty and staff are all encouraged to access the SOURCE's various resources and volunteer opportunities. Annual Volunteer Fair: Community-based organizations set up display booths and acquaint students, faculty and staff with potential field experience and collaborative research projects. Held in September.



Community Walking Tours: Community leaders take potential volunteers on scheduled walks through the East Baltimore neighborhood to familiarize students with the community. Held in summer and fall months.

One-Time Service Projects: The SOURCE coordinates one-time service projects for those who lack the time to volunteer more frequently.

Student Seminars: Seminars familiarize students with the work done by community-based organizations and encourage collaboration between students and the community.

Weekly Service Scoop: The SOURCE emails a weekly update of the latest opportunities for community involvement.

Charity/Donation Drives: Ongoing charity drives are conducted throughout the year to benefit the community.

Community Service Awards: Awards are given to students who have performed outstanding service with a community-based organization.
