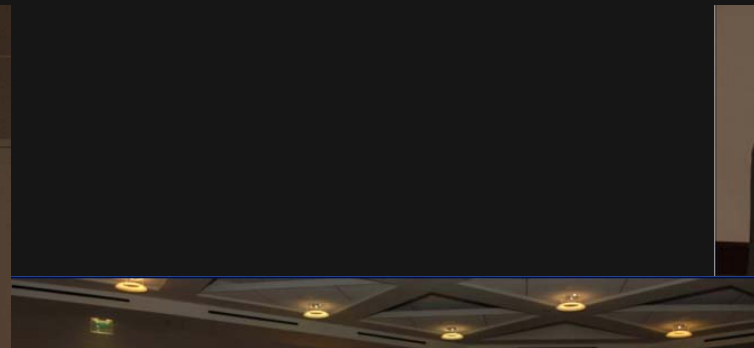
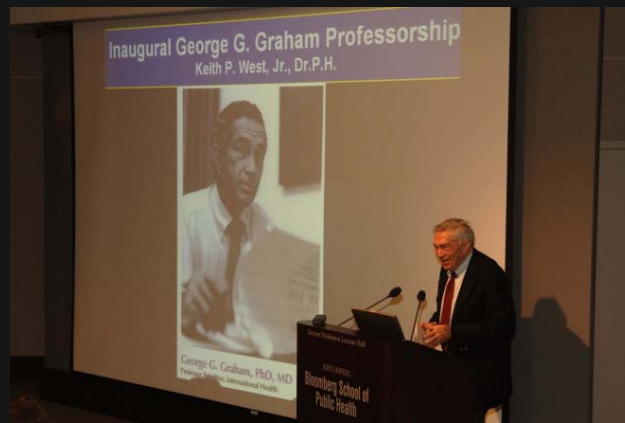
George G. Graham, M.D.

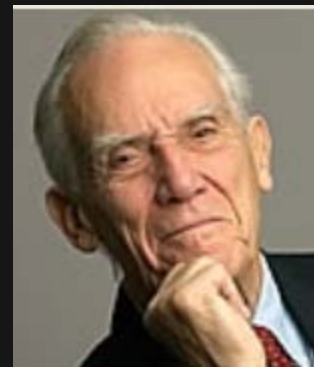
Nevin Scrimshaw, PhD, MS

- Institute Professor Emeritus at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology
- Founding Director of the International Food and Nutrition Planning Program at MIT
- Founding Director of the Institute of Nutrition of Central America and Panama (INCAP)
- Initiated and directed the World Hunger Program, and the Food, Nutrition, Human and Social Development Programme of the United Nations University (UNU)
- World Food Prize Laureate (1991)
- Presidential Gold Medal “Heroes of Public Health” Award of Mexico; Knighted by the King of Thailand
- Author of >650 scientific publications



Carl E. Taylor, M.D., Dr.P.H.

- Founder and first director of the Department of International Health at JHSPH in 1961—the first of its kind at any school of public health.
- Worked for 30 years in India—first as director of a Presbyterian Mission Hospital (Memorial Hospital) and as head of Preventive and Social Medicine Department at the Christian Medical college in Ludhiana
- Director of the Narangwal Project in India
- Director of UNICEF in China from 1984-1987
- Numerous awards: US Presidential Award for Service to Children of the World in Especially Difficult Circumstances.
- Co-authored “Just and Lasting Change: When Communities Own Their Futures”, published by Johns Hopkins University Press
- Teacher and Mentor to generations of public and international Health workers

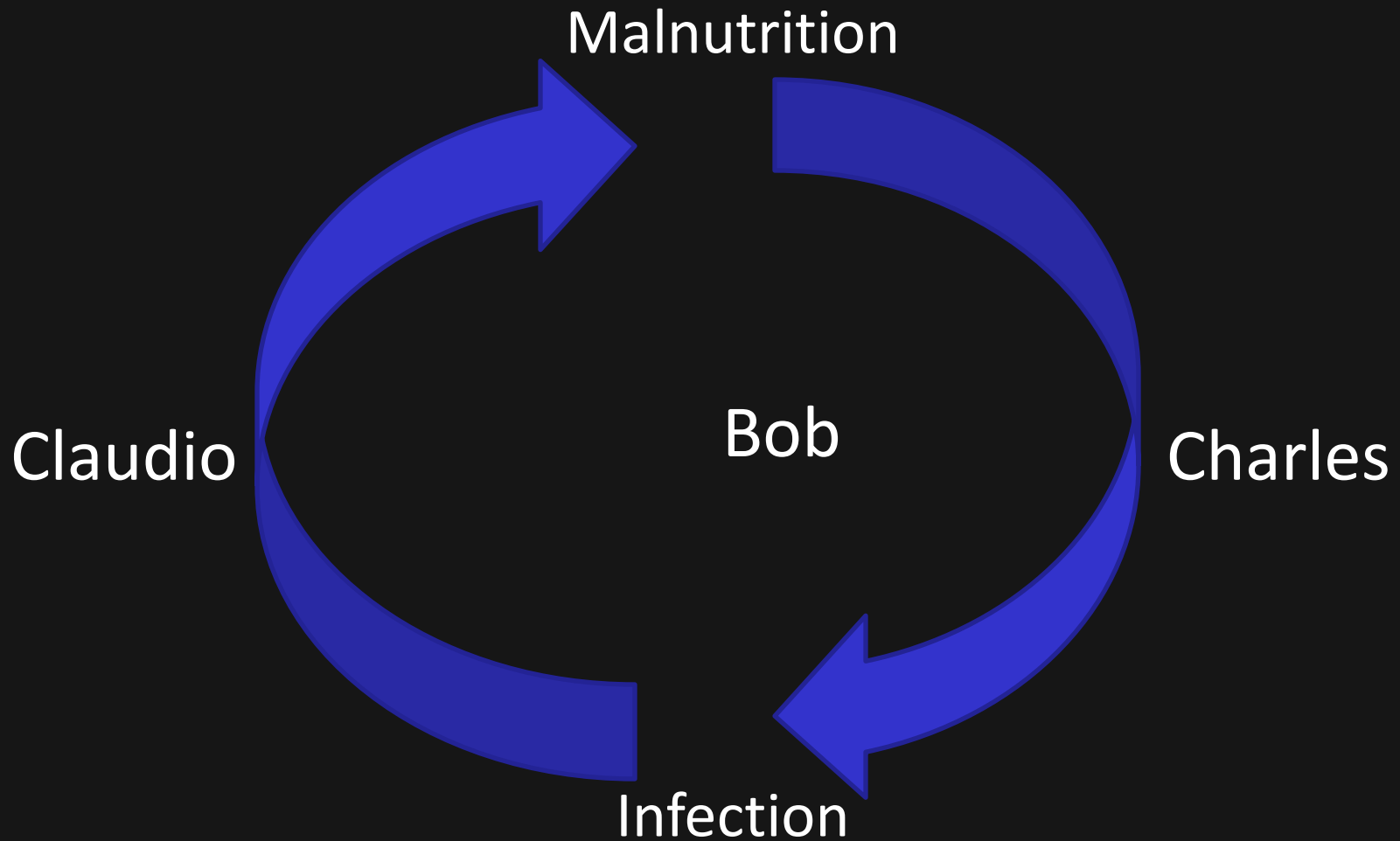
