



**Virginia M. Miller, M.B.A., Ph.D.**

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Dr. Miller is Professor of Surgery and Physiology and Director of the Women's Health Research Center at Mayo Clinic, Rochester, MN. She received a BS in education from Slippery Rock University, Slippery Rock, PA, a MBA from the University of Minnesota, and her PhD in Physiology from the University of Missouri, Columbia, MO. Her research includes work with experimental animals and clinical studies focusing on how sex steroids, like estrogen, and conditions unique to women such as pregnancy and menopause affect cardiovascular health and cognition. She currently serves Principal Investigator of Mayo Clinic's Building Interdisciplinary Careers in Women's Health (BIRCWH) scholars program and previous Principal Investigator for Mayo Clinic Specialized Center of Research on Sex Differences. She has authored over 250 original publications and reviews. She has received numerous awards including the Bernadine Healy Award for Visionary Leadership in Women's Health, the Women's Day Magazine Red Dress Award for her work in research and advocacy for women's health, and the Paul M. Vanhoutte Named Lecture in Vascular Pharmacology from the American Society for Pharmacology and Experimental Therapeutics. She has worked with international groups in the promotion for the inclusion of sex and gender variables in basic and medical curricula and research. In addition to service on various grant review panels and editorial boards for scientific journals, she served as a member of the governing council for the American Physiological Society (APS) and as President of the Organization for the Study of Sex Differences (OSSD).
