Dr. Robert Temple has been Deputy Center Director for Clinical Science at FDA's Center for Drug Evaluation and Research since 2009, participating in the direction of the Center's operations. He is also Acting Deputy Director of the Office of Drug Evaluation I (ODE-I). ODE-I is responsible for the regulation of cardio-renal, neuropharmacologic, and psychopharmacologic drug products. Dr. Temple served as Director, Office of Medical Policy from 1999-2009.

The Office of Medical Policy is responsible for regulation of promotion through the Office of Prescription Drug Products (formerly, Division of Drug Marketing, Advertising, and Communication) and for assessing quality of clinical trials. Dr. Temple has a long-standing interest in the design and conduct of clinical trials and has written extensively on this subject, especially on choice of control group in clinical trials, evaluation of active control and non-inferiority trials, trials to evaluate dose-response, and trials using "enrichment" designs.
