Three Key Things to Remember

- ► There are Welch Medical Library Informationists available to help you
- ► The Welch Medical Library makes a vast range of high-quality resources available to you at your fingertips through out website
- ► If there are journal articles or books that you need that Hopkins doesn't have access to, you can order them free of charge

How Informationists Can Help

- Answer questions about library resources and services
- Refine the research topic to an answerable question
- Recommend information sources or databases for the search topic
- Identify relevant search terms
- Suggest reference management software and strategies
- ► Teach students and researchers to become expert, independent searchers of scientific literature

Help with Searching the Literature

- Training for individuals on efficient literature searching of PubMed, Embase, Web of Science, Scopus, etc.
- ➤ Searching support for presentations, research proposals, thesis proposals, grant proposals, research decision-making, article publication, etc.
- Collaboration on systematic reviews and comprehensive literature reviews

Resources for Finding Funding

- Advise on searching in a variety of sources, including the databases Pivot and NIH RePORTER.
- Guidance on locating funding from governmental, corporate, international, and foundation-based sources.
- ► Tools for finding funding are available on the library's <u>Grants and Funding Guide</u>.

Assistance with Preparing Your Publications

- ► Training on tools used for managing PDFs and citations such as RefWorks and EndNote. We also have the <u>Citation Management Guide</u> you can reference.
- Advising about requirements for managing and sharing research data.
- ► Tools for journal selection, writing support, and citation management are available on the library's <u>Writing and Publishing Guide</u>.

Library Collections

Access from the Welch Medical Library to:

- PubMed with links to Hopkins full-text.
- Online holdings with more than 400 databases, 7,000 e-journals, and 11,000 e-books.
- ► Collections from across Hopkins through the <u>Library Catalog</u>.
- Books from the Ivy League through <u>BorrowDirect.</u>
- ► A world of other resources through <u>WelDoc</u>, the library's interlibrary loan service.

Hopkins Researcher Profiles

- ► Use <u>JHU Experts Research Profiles</u> to learn more about faculty members at Hopkins.
- ► Offers detailed profiles of faculty, including research interests, publications, publication trends, and co-author networks.

Wide Range of Training Opportunities

- ► Free, hands-on classes cover topics including literature searching, citation management software, managing research data, and bioinformatics databases.
